1. Delete: On page 184, under **Minor in Asian Studies**, the first sentence:

The Asian Studies minor offers interdisciplinary courses which have a substantial Asian focus and/or content.

Add: On page 184, in place of deleted entry:

The Asian Studies minor offers students an opportunity to explore the dynamic transformations that are sweeping through Asia, while situating these processes within a historical, philosophical/ethical, political, economic, cultural, religious, and literary context. This interdisciplinary approach is designed to provide students with a broad foundation of ideas and perspectives with which to understand and explain the challenges and opportunities facing Asia within a global context.

2. Add: On page 184, to the list of elective courses, before the entry for HIST 380:

Impact Statement:

There will be no added faculty resources needed for this change. The changes are updates to the catalog courses in the IST program. The impact is in providing students in the Asian Studies Minor with more courses, thereby helping them to complete the minor in a timely manner.

Rationale:

The Asian Studies Minor (ASIA) in the Interdisciplinary Studies (IST) program has seen much growth. Students in the Asian Studies minor have expressed very strong interest in taking introductory and elective interdisciplinary courses in Asian Studies (ASIA). These courses will respond to this student demand. ASIA 100 will also help the IST program in its program assessment goals.
