Statement of Faculty Senate Action:

**Change the title and course description for MGMT 489**

**Effective Date: Fall 2012**

**1. Delete:** On page 205, the entry for **MGMT 489, Professional and Technical Internship:**

**489 Professional and Technical Internship (3)**

Semester long internship with a participating host organization, preferably in the Western North Carolina area, scheduled for Management students in the senior year. Specific information is available from the director of the internship program. Prerequisites: Minimum 2.0 grade point average overall and in major courses; permission of department internship director. Every semester.

**Add:** On page 205, in place of deleted entry:

**489 Project-Based Professional Internship (3)**

Semester long, project-based internship with a participating host organization, preferably in the Western North Carolina area, typically scheduled for Management students in their senior year. Specific information is available from the Department Internship Coordinator. Prerequisites: Minimum 2.0 grade point average overall and in major courses; permission of the Department Internship coordinator. Fall and Spring.

**Impact:**

A member of the faculty is now teaching the internship course that was previously taught by the Internship Director, and coordination will have to be done by a faculty member. Release time given to a coordinator for administrative duties decreases the number of other courses that can be offered. Summer options for the internship course are being removed, lowering income to the school and reducing the students' flexibility in completing major requirements.

**Rationale:**

The Department had an internship director who handled all of the coordination, class work and structural functions of the Management internship program. The position was eliminated, and these functions must now be performed by Departmental faculty.
