**Impact Statement**: ASIA 100, Introduction to Asian Studies and INTS 201, Introduction to Global Studies are appropriate as introductory course options for students in the International Studies concentration. These proposed additions to the concentration options will be taught by existing faculty in the program and will require no additional resource allocations. The courses will also help the IST program administer its assessment plan, as well as achieve its assessment goals in terms of student learning outcomes and program operational goals.

**Rationale:** The International Studies Concentration (INTS) in the Interdisciplinary Studies (IST) program has seen much recent growth. Students in the INTS major have expressed strong interest in taking introductory and advanced interdisciplinary courses in the area of International Studies (INTS) and Asian Studies (ASIA). Adding the ASIA and INTS courses as options for the concentration is a response to this growing student demand.
