Statement of Faculty Senate Action:

**APC Document 30:** **Clarification of Greek or Latin Language Requirement  
for the Classical Studies Concentration**

**Effective Date: Fall 2016**

**1. Delete:** On page 107, under **Concentration in Classical Studies, item I:**

- I. Required courses in the major—37 hours, including 3 hours from CLAS 250 or 354; 4 hours from 315 or 316; 3 hours from 350 or 356; 6 hours from 343, 344, 345; 6 hours from Greek or Latin language courses; 12 additional hours of Classics courses at the 300-400 level; and CLAS 498. ANTH 225, PHIL 250 or 255 may be substituted for 3 of the 12 additional hours. Other elective courses may also be substituted with prior approval of department chair.

**Add:** On page 107, in place of deleted entry:

- I. Required courses in the major—37 hours, including 3 hours from CLAS 250 or 354; 4 hours from 315 or 316; 3 hours from 350 or 356; 6 hours from 343, 344, 345; 6 hours from Greek or Latin language courses at the 200-400 level; 12 additional hours of Classics courses at the 300-400 level; and CLAS 498. ANTH 225, PHIL 250 or 255 may be substituted for 3 of the 12 additional hours. Other elective courses may also be substituted with prior approval of the department chair.

**Impact Statement:** The proposed changes will have no negative impact on staffing or other departmental resources. The proposed addition clarifies for students that CLAS 101-104 cannot count towards the major requirements.

**Rationale:** The additional wording is needed to clarify that the introductory courses in Latin or Greek cannot be counted towards the major concentration in Classical Studies. In effect, this means that students are required to take two Greek or Latin courses beyond the introductory levels in order to meet the Classical Studies major requirements.
