### VI. Administration/Academic Affairs:

Provost Joseph Urgo

<u>COACHE Survey.</u> One concern from the COACHE Survey is the perspective by junior faculty members that tenure and promotion guidelines lack clarity. Having just gone through reappointments for about a dozen faculty on the tenure track, Provost Urgo is seeing some incredible careers getting started and thinking about how we are going to sustain these careers over years of high course loads and limited access to reassigned time. Provost Urgo asked Jessica Stowell to look into this data.

Jessica Stowell said she has focused on the junior faculty data and will be able to more fully report on this in a few weeks. An overview of results show that while pre-tenured faculty are more satisfied with course load than tenured faculty, pre-tenure faculty are less satisfied with the equity of course loads. They also noted issues of balance between teaching loads and service. Tuition waiver issues, employment for spouses, recognition for scholarship/service, and a lack of diversity are the issues that are bubbling up from junior faculty.

<u>NCUR moderating sign-ups.</u> Provost Urgo encourages faculty to sign-up to moderate a session. He looks forward to seeing all faculty involved.

<u>New Grants Manager</u>. Provost Urgo announced we have just hired a Grants Manager for Academic Affairs. This is the position formerly held by Phyllis Stiles which was in Advancement. We moved this position from Advancement into Academic Affairs so that the person will be working full time to support faculty grants activities, getting information about grants out, and coaching people on writing grants. The new Grants Manager's name is Charlotte Smith, and she will be here the beginning of April. She is the Associate Director of Sponsored Programs at Appalachian State University and has been in this business a long time.

Board of Governors' April Meeting. UNC Asheville is planning for the BOG April meeting that will be held on our campus on April 14-15. It is the tradition at these meetings to give the Board of Governors a tour of the campus. Last time when the board was in Fayetteville, Provost Urgo took the tour to understand how the tour was conducted. After a discussion with some board members, Provost Urgo decided we are going to give them the academic experience of our campus by dividing the board members into groups of three which will each visit three classes. Provost Urgo will be asking the professors of those classes to stop the class for 20 minutes for the professor to introduce class subject and discussion topic and give students a chance to say what they are studying, why they are there, and what their career ambitions are. This will give the Board of Governors a sense of what we do "on the ground" here for the classroom is the heart of our enterprise. Then they will go over to Highsmith to visit with the Career Center, the Key Center, and the Intercultural Center. And then close with a trip to the observatory when it gets dark. We hope this will give them a nice, robust experience. Faculty have responded well to this and Provost Urgo is very grateful.

Strategic Planning. Since there is wide, clear consensus on who we are and who we want to be, the strategic planning experience has been collegial and productive. Graduate Program development may be the area where we still not sure about many things. However, our undergraduate mission and the quality of the academic program, there isn't much questioning. We have core values in diversity efforts and sustainability. Off campus comments are consistent about who we are and our identity. When we talk about how to divide "the pie" up -- into resource allocations-- is where the process will be challenging.

In regards to graduate programs, Provost Urgo believes none of us want graduate programs at large. Provost Urgo is in favor of innovative, ambitious, energetic faculty members who see something they want to try to accomplish then we can talk about that. If a department comes forward to say it wants to offer a graduate degree, we all will want to know who all is interested in taking this, how the program would be delivered, how does it fit with our mission, etc. Talking about it in the abstract is very difficult.

<u>Process to follow now the bond has been passed.</u> The Administration didn't want to move forward on this until after the bond was passed. Now it has passed, they are beginning to talk about the master planning process for Owen and Carmichael. One of the biggest challenges we will have is how to renovate without space that these areas can move to – that will have to be worked out.

Congratulations to both the Men's and Women's Basketball Teams. It is phenomenal to have both the men's and women's teams on one campus "in the dance" as they say when they go to the NCAA tournament. Provost Urgo will be going to Kentucky this weekend with the women's team. Chancellor Grant will go to Brooklyn with the men's team. We are getting complimentary press on this including one of our men's basketball team members was asking for WIFI in the hotel because he had homework to do.

Mark Sidelnick also wanted to bring up that both men's and women's basketball coaches were recognized by various coaching agencies as Coach of the Year. This has only happened for a Big South Team twice in its history.

Provost Urgo suggested the Faculty Senate pass a Sense of the Senate congratulating the basketball teams.

Dr. Sidelnick asked that the Athletic Director Janet Cone be included in that resolution. Faculty Senate will take this up in the New Business portion of the meeting.
