Statement of Faculty Senate Action:

APC Document 39 (CLAS): **Revise the descriptions and increase the credit hours for
CLAS 212, 250 and 498**

Effective Date: Fall 2018

1. Delete: On page 106, the entry for **CLAS 212:**

212 Intermediate Latin (3)
Review and further study of the fundamentals of grammar and translation,
introduction to elements of classical culture. Prerequisite: CLAS 102. Spring.

Add: On page 106, in place of deleted entry:

212 Intermediate Latin (4)
Review and further study of Latin grammar and translation, with extensive reading of
literature selections and introduction to elements of classical culture, including
scansion of meter. To be applicable to the language requirement in the Classical
Language and Literatures concentration, the course must be completed before
enrolling in any 300-400 level Latin language course. Prerequisite: CLAS 102. See
department chair.

2. Delete: On page 107, the entry for CLAS 250:

250 Mythology (3)
Survey of some of the best-known Greco-Roman myths including their portrayal in
literature and art, their significance for the culture of their time, and general
theoretical treatments of myth. Odd years Fall.

Add: On page 107, in place of deleted entry:

250 Mythology (4)
Survey of some of the best-known Greco-Roman myths including their portrayal in
literature and art, their significance for the culture of their time, comparative studies
in world mythology, and general theoretical treatments of myth. Pre- or corequisite:
HUM 124. Odd years Fall.

3. Delete: On page 109, the entry for **CLAS 498:**

498 Senior Capstone: Classics in Translation (3)

Senior capstone course taught in translation on varying topics. This interdisciplinary course integrates literary, historical and cultural issues and is required of Classics majors. The course is also open to advanced students in other majors who have completed the Humanities program or similar courses, and are interested in exploring text and ideas that have influenced 2500 years of Western civilization of technology throughout. Students will demonstrate Writing and Information Literacy competencies in this course. Prerequisite: Senior standing. Fall.

Add: On page 109, in place of deleted entry:

498 Senior Capstone (4)

Capstone course taught in translation on varying topics, with an added component of undergraduate research and its presentation. This interdisciplinary course integrates literary, historical, and cultural issues and is required of Classics majors and minors. The course is also open to advanced students in other majors who are interested in exploring texts and ideas that have influenced 2500 years of Western civilization. Students will demonstrate with writing and information literacy competencies in this course. Prerequisite: Senior standing for Classics majors; junior or senior standing for Classics minors and non-majors. Fall.

Impact: These changes will not have a negative impact, but improve our sustainability by moving these courses into our four-hour curriculum.

Rationale: These changes are part of the department's move to a four-hour curriculum. The changes in prerequisites either clarify current practice (CLAS 212 and 498) or represent a change the department requested in order to better serve students enrolled in the course (CLAS 250).
