1. Delete: On page 166, entry for HIST 309:

309 History of the "Old South" (3)

Examines the social, political, and cultural development of the very distinctive region that became known as "The South," from the colonial through antebellum periods in British colonial America/the United States. Explores the ways in which the cultures of the region – American Indian, African/African American, and white – constructed their societies, and how identities changed as a result of contact with other races, ethnicities, and persons of different socio-economic levels. See department chair.

Add: On page 166, in place of deleted entry:

309 History of the "Old South" (4)

Examines the social, political, and cultural development of the very distinctive region that became known as "The South," from the colonial through antebellum periods in British colonial America/the United States. Explores the ways in which the cultures of the region – American Indian, African/African American, and white – constructed their societies, and how identities changed as a result of contact with other races, ethnicities, and persons of different socio-economic levels. Intensive work with primary sources and scholarly interpretations of the period will support advanced research. See department chair.

Impact: This change will have no known negative impact on the History major, minor and university requirements and won't affect the department's staffing or resource needs. Changing HIST 309 from 3 to 4 credit hours was inadvertently left out of the department's curricular revision last academic year.

Rationale: The additional hour will enable critical analysis of the construction of "Old South" as a marker of identity as well as the necessary deeper research in both secondary and primary sources.
