Statement of Faculty Senate Action:

**APC Document 19 (HIST):** **Add new course, HIST 392, Global Revolutions**

**Effective Date: Fall 2020**

**1. Add:** On page 167, new course, **HIST 392, Global Revolutions:**

**392 Global Revolutions (4)**

Peace--Land--Bread! Liberty--Equality--Fraternity! Such have been the demands of revolutionaries across the globe since the French Revolution of 1789. This course will analyze the revolutionary scripts from 1789 that influenced revolutions in France, and its former colonies including Vietnam and Algeria, as well as the Atlantic Revolutions in Latin America, Communist Revolutions in Russia and China, and revolutions in Egypt and Tunisia during the Arab Spring of 2011. See department chair.

**Impact:** No impact on staffing or rotation of courses. This course replaces HIST 358 (removed from the curriculum in 2019) in Dr. Rizzo's rotation. Only she will teach it. The course will enroll up to 22 students; have a lecture/discussion format; meet 200 minutes per week; fulfill an elective in the International Studies concentration and the History major and minor; be offered every other year; and meet the same SLOs as all other 300-level HIST courses (critical thinking, research in primary and secondary sources, discipline appropriate written and oral expression). The course has been approved for Diversity Intensive designation.

**Rationale:** The course was taught in Spring 2019 with 18 students enrolled. It adds more global history to our menu of upper level History courses.
