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Statement of Faculty Senate Action:

APC Document 19 (HIST): Revise the requirements for the major in History and History with

Teacher Licensure;

Revise the requirements for the Minor in History;

Update the required credit hours for the International Studies

concentration in Interdisciplinary Studies;

Update the Social Studies entries throughout the catalog

Effective Date: Fall 2022

1. **Delete:** On page 165, under **Major in History:**

- I. Required courses in the major—40 hours: HIST 101, 102, 151, 152, 250, 451, 452; 4 hours from American History (category II); 4 hours from European History (category III); 4 hours from World History (category IV); 12 additional hours at 300-400 level.
- II. Required courses outside the major—None.
- III. Other departmental requirements—Major competency is satisfied in HIST 452. The course must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Add: On page 165, in place of deleted entry:

- I. Required courses in the major—42 hours: HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152, 250, 451, 452; 4 hours from American History (category II); 4 hours from European History (category III); 4 hours from World History (category IV); 12 additional hours at 300-400 level.
- II. Required courses outside the major—None.
- III. Other departmental requirements—Major competency is satisfied in HIST 452. The course must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

2. Delete: On page 165, under History with Teacher Licensure:

- I. Required courses in the major—40 hours: HIST 101, 102, 151, 152, 250, 451, 452; HIST 312 for American History (category II); 4 hours from European History (category III); 4 hours from World History (category IV); and 12 additional hours at 300-400 level. HIST 315 is required for students seeking 6–9 licensure.
- II. Required courses outside the major—12 hours: ECON 103; PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog.
- III. Other departmental requirements—Major competency is satisfied in HIST 452. The course must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Add: On page 165, in place of deleted entry:

- I. Required courses in the major—42 hours: HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152, 250, 451, 452; HIST 312 for American History (category II); 4 hours from European History (category III); 4 hours from World History (category IV); and 12 additional hours at 300-400 level. HIST 315 is required for students seeking 6–9 licensure.
- II. Required courses outside the major—12 hours: ECON 103; PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog.
- III. Other departmental requirements—Major competency is satisfied in HIST 452. The course must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Delete: On page 165, the entry under **Minor in History:**

20 hours in History: HIST 101, 102, 151, 152 and 12 additional hours at the 300-400 level. University-wide minimum requirements for a minor: 1) one-half of the hours required for a minor must be completed in residence at UNC Asheville, to include at least 6 hours at the 300-400 level; 2) students must have a cumulative grade-point-average of at least 2.0 on minor courses taken at UNC Asheville.

Add: On page 165, in place of deleted entry:

20 hours in History: HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152, and 12 additional hours at the 300-400 level. University-wide minimum requirements for a minor: 1) one-half of the hours required for a minor must be completed in residence at UNC Asheville, to include at least 6 hours at the 300-400 level; 2) students must have a cumulative grade-point-average of at least 2.0 on minor courses taken at UNC Asheville.

4. Delete: On page 190, item I under Requirements for Concentration in International Studies:

I. Required courses for the major—at least 24 including an introductory course chosen from AFST 130, ANTH 100, ASIA 100, ESI 101, HIST 152, INTS 201, IST 290, POLS 281 or RELS 280; at least 18 hours of international studies related coursework from the courses listed below; and INTS 494. The 18 elective hours must be chosen from a minimum of three disciplines, with at least 12 hours at the 300-level or above. Other appropriate courses with an international focus may be approved by the program director.

Add: On page 190, in place of deleted entry:

I. Required courses for the major—at least 25 including an introductory course chosen from AFST 130, ANTH 100, ASIA 100, ESI 101, HIST 152, INTS 201, IST 290, POLS 281 or RELS 280; at least 18 hours of international studies related coursework from the courses listed below; and INTS 494. The 18 elective hours must be chosen from a minimum of three disciplines, with at least 12 hours at the 300-level or above. Other appropriate courses with an international focus may be approved by the program director.

- **5. Replace:** On the pages listed for majors with Social Studies Licensure and in the Education Section of the catalog, the previous History Survey requirements with the new:
 - a) On page 120, item II under **Economics with Teacher Licensure**:
 - II. Required courses outside the major—24 hours: HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152; POLS 220 or 281; PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220; STAT 185 or 225. HIST 315 is also required for students seeking 6-9 licensure. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog.
 - b) On page 128, under item II in the **Middle School Licensure section, the Social Studies entry**:
 - Social Studies—24 hours: ECON 103; HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152, 315; POLS 220 or 281; PSYC 319.
 - c) On page 128, item II under **Secondary School Licensure**:
 - II. Required courses outside Education—4–20 hours, including PSYC 319. In addition, Latin candidates must take LANG 395. Social Studies candidates must take ECON 103, HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152; POLS 220 or 281; and one course from SOC 200 or 220. History majors must take HIST 312 instead of POLS 220 or 281.
 - d) On page 270, item II under **Political Science with Teacher Licensure**:
 - II. Required courses outside the major—28 hours: ECON 103; HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152; POLS 220 or 281 (will apply to the major requirement); PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220; either STAT 185 or 225. HIST 315 is also required for students seeking 6-9 licensure. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog.
 - e) On page 290, item II under **Sociology with Teacher licensure**:
 - II. Required courses for licensure—24 hours: ECON 103; HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152; POLS 220 or 281; PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220 (this course may be used to fulfill a lower-level major elective). HIST 315 is also required for students seeking 6-9 licensure. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog. STAT 185 is recommended for students wishing to pursue additional skills in quantitative analysis.
 - f) On page 291, item II under **Anthropology with Teacher Licensure**:
 - II. Required courses for licensure—24 hours: ECON 103; HIST 101 or 102, 151 or 152; POLS 220 or 281; PSYC 319; one course from SOC 200 or 220 (this course may be used to fulfill a lower-level major elective). HIST 315 is also required for students seeking 6-9 licensure. In addition, students must complete the required EDUC courses as indicated in the Education section of the catalog. STAT 185 is recommended for students wishing to pursue additional skills in quantitative analysis.

Impact: With the increase in credit hours for HIST 452, History majors will need 42 hours instead of 40. There will be no change in the credit hours required for Social Studies licensure as a result of increasing the credit hours for HIST 101, 102, 151, and 152 because the students will now take only two of the courses instead of all 4. The hours listed for the International Studies concentration will increase by 1 rather than 2 because IST 290 is 3 credits.

Rationale: These are editorial changes that reflect the changes to the History survey courses (101, 102, 151, 152) and HIST 452.
